EASTER REVISION COURSES: KEY INFORMATION

All main GCSE/ IGCSE, AS/ A2, A-level, IB & Pre-U subjects and exam boards covered. Revision of foundation courses in Maths, Physics (Engineering) and Business/ Economics also covered.

One-on-one or two-on-one tuition can be arranged for students taking non-core subjects. £500 for 10 hours' one-on-one with a level 1 tutor; £600 for 10 hours' one-on-one with a senior tutor. £35 per student per hour for 10 hours' two-on-one.

£350 for 15 hours' A-level/ IB or Pre-U tuition; £300 for 15 hours' GCSE/ IGCSE tuition.

£200 for 8-hour seminar courses in English, History, Classics & RS (set topics & set texts); £225 for 10-hour essay writing courses (for essay-writing courses students will be put in a group with others from their school year group).

Small group tuition (10-12 students maximum per class).

Homework set and marked throughout the course.

Students receive individual feedback on their work and individual reports are provided in each subject at the end of the course.

SAMPLE TUTOR PROFILES

Ben (Biology; Chemistry)

Ben is currently undertaking a PhD in Clinical Medicine at the University of Cambridge. He was also an undergraduate at Cambridge where he studied Medicine and Veterinary Science and achieved exam results that placed him in the top 5% of his year. Ben has been a visiting researcher at the University of Surrey, and a summer research student at the Department of Physiology, Development and Neuroscience at Cambridge. Ben specialises in teaching all three sciences at all levels.

Bono (Physics; Maths; Further Maths)

Bono is a second year PhD student at Cambridge, studying High Energy Physics. He has extensive experience of teaching Physics and Maths to students from A-level to university level, and has successfully given guidance to many students applying to Oxbridge for these subjects. He teaches first year Cambridge undergraduates Physics and Maths.

Emma (French; History; English)

Emma is in her third year of AHRC-funded doctoral research in the UCL French Department. She currently supervises final year History undergraduates at Cambridge on the topic of the Anglo-French cultural exchange, and is also involved in running the choir at Christ's College. Emma completed her undergraduate studies in French and Latin at Churchill College, Cambridge in 2011, and went on to complete the MPhil in European Literature & Culture in the MML department at Cambridge. During her time in Cambridge, she was also awarded choral scholarships at Christ's College and Jesus College.

George (Biology; Chemistry)

George is completing his medical degree (MB BChir) at King's College, Cambridge. In 2013 he graduated from the same institution with a degree in Pharmacology, where his research interests were primarily in anti-hyperlipidaemic therapy. Outside of formal education, George has undertaken work in hospitals in rural Kenya, helping in the healthcare of a community with a high burden of infectious disease. He specialises in advising students on their applications to medical school, and tutoring Biology and Chemistry at A-level.



Jane Slinn (Director, Independent Thinkers Education; English; History; Latin; Philosophy)

Jane Slinn studied for her BA, M.Phil. and Ph.D. in English Literature at King's College, Cambridge. For ten years, she taught eighteenth-century and Romantic literature, philosophy of art and literary theory at the University of Cambridge. She has also lectured on the Pembroke-King's Programme. Jane has been tutoring English, History, Latin and Philosophy for GCSE, A-level, IB and Pre-U for over twelve years.

He was formerly a Research Fellow at Trinity College, Cambridge, and is now a lecturer at UCL. He has over 200 hours' tutoring, supervising and lecturing experience across a broad range of ages. He has undertaken a variety of Outreach work, and has worked in the Admissions departments of Imperial and Cambridge Universities. He particularly enjoys teaching A-level Physics.

Luke (Classics – Latin & Greek; History; Art History; Religious Studies)

Luke was an undergraduate at Oxford from where he was awarded a double first in Classics. He went on to receive his M.Phil. and Ph.D. in Latin Literature from Trinity College, Cambridge and a Masters in Art History from the Courtauld Institute. He currently teaches Latin and Greek at UCL and Birkbeck College, and tutors younger students in classical subjects.

Rebekah (History; Philosophy; Politics; English; Psychology)

Rebekah recently graduated from King's College, Cambridge with a double first in Politics, Psychology and Sociology. During her degree, she focused particularly on politics, developing strong academic interests in eighteenth-century political thought, and in gender studies. She is currently working in London before she begins her Masters degree in October 2016. Rebekah specialises in tutoring social science subjects at all levels and particularly enjoys teaching students how to improve their essay writing.
